Allebria, Christ is Risen!

Alleluia Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed Alleluia. We begin every Easter service this way and I love the proclamation of God's victory over sin, death and the devil. Which is why sometimes it is so shocking to us that the very first Easter did not start this way. In fact the very first Easter started in sadness and proceeded to great confusion. Confusion about what had happened, what was happening, and what was going to happen.

We hear in John 20: 11But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; 12and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. 13They said to her. "Woman. why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." 14When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. 15Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." 16Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). 17Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" 18Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

As you read the text, I hope you could hear the confusion that was about that first Easter. There was confusion about what had happened because what they knew to be defeat Jesus had been unjustly crucified, all of a sudden might not be the tragedy the thought it. Now when you read the gospels you probably wonder if the disciples are all very dense. After all, Jesus says things so clearly that he will be betrayed and killed. However, remember the gospel writers have taken over a year's worth of ministry and boiled it down into a small book. Jesus taught them so many things over that year and he did so many miracles that I think we can realize that those teachings about him being betrayed, killed, and raised, might have been less prominent before he was betrayed, killed, and raised. On that morning, they were confused about what they had been through the last week.

Could it really have been God's will? Could it really have been that Jesus knew it was going to happen and didn't stop it? And how did they feel about all the tears that they shed if in truth it was all for God's glory? We sometimes find out new information about the past that doesn't change what happened, but how we understand it. For instance, sometimes when Mary and I have an argument, at the end of the argument I gain some insight into what she was thinking, and it changes the entire tenor of what we have been fighting about. She still has said the same thing...but they are changed because I know understand the why of what she said. It can be hard to find your footing when you are not sure about the past.

The disciples were also confused about what was happening. In John 20 we hear that John and Peter run to the tomb, but they leave confused. What they see, an empty tomb, is so unusual, that they do not have an immediate explanation.

It could have been so many things: grave robbers, they are looking at the wrong grave, Joseph of Arimathea wanted the grave back, enemies of Jesus stole the body, or even alien abduction. It could also have been that Jesus was raised from the dead, but I wonder if they would even let their minds go there, after all could their hearts handle it if it were not true? We sometimes live in times when we do not know what is happening, or we know what is happening but have no idea why! It is hard to wait when you are in uncertain times and all we want is a secure explanation for what is happening.

The disciples are also confused about the future. Though John and Peter go home, Mary waits by the tomb. She just wonders about what the past means and what is going on there, but mostly she just waits to see what she should do next. And because of her willingness to just wait on the Lord, she is rewarded as the first witness to the resurrection. She then gets to proclaim what has been and what is going on because she has been joined to God's future.

For us today we live in that future, we do not have the disciples' confusion because Mary's proclamation makes the story clear to us. In the same way we need to bind ourselves to waiting for God's leading in our lives and in the church. Let us wait with anticipation for God to move us as we continue to celebrate God's grace and appreciates all God's people through sharing Christ's Story. When we as Christians are in confusion we pray and wait for God's clear action, if this season in your life is one of confusion wait and pray as Mary did, so that when God acts in your life you may be ready to proclaim God's great gifts! Again, I proclaim Alleluia Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia!




NEW ORLEANS BONDING DAY
